The Missouri Emergency Services Instructor Conference prepares and presents training programs for emergency services personnel and public fire educators. Instructors and other supervisory personnel will find this conference valuable in planning for the training needs of their organizations. Whether you are just starting out or have been involved with training for many years, this conference will benefit you.

## PRECONFERENCE

This year we are excited to expand our traditional preconference offering of train-the-trainer courses to also include two Missouri Division of Fire Safety certification eligible courses delivered in an online blended format.

### Online Blended Learning

Online blended learning courses trade a significant portion of travel and classroom time for the convenience of structured, interactive online learning with remote instructor support. Participants must register and complete the self-paced online modules in addition to attending the course during the preconference.

### Train-the-Trainer Courses

Train-the-Trainer courses are reserved for instructors certified by the Missouri Division of Fire Safety. If you are not affiliated with a Missouri fire department, this requirement may be waived. Participants will receive all of the curriculum and training to deliver the selected courses as a *MU Fire and Rescue Training Institute Registered Program*. ## CONFERENCE

The conference consists of a general session with keynote speakers and is followed by instructor workshops. It is the goal of these presentations to prepare and elevate the training abilities of emergency service professionals.

### General Session

### Continuing Education Credit

The Missouri Division of Fire Safety has approved continuing education credits for most of the preconference courses and all of the conference workshops.

# PRECONFERENCE

## ONLINE BLENDED LEARNING COURSES

### Fire Service Instructor I

Michael Novak, Battalion Chief, Branson Fire and Rescue

This course addresses *NFPA 1041, Standard for Fire Instructor Professional Qualifications*, Chapter 4, 2012 edition competencies at the fire service instructor I level. This course focuses on the presentation skills needed by new instructors delivering prepared lesson plans. Students will cover lesson plan preparation, presentation skills, using audiovisual equipment, identifying lesson objectives, questions, tests, and evaluation instruments.

This is a blended delivery course. Participants will meet in-person with their laptop for the first day of class and to receive their log-in credentials. The remainder of the class will be instructor-led through an online portal during the seven weeks that follow. This course requires a computer, and reliable Internet access. The scheduled completion of this course is December 24, 2017.

### Live Fire Instructor

Missouri Division of Fire Safety

**Prerequisite:** *Fire Service Instructor I, Fire Fighter I, and Fire Fighter II.*

Structural fire experience may be substituted in lieu of *Fire Fighter I and II.*

This course addresses *NFPA 1403, Standard on Live Fire Training Evolutions*, Chapters 4, 6-9, 2012 edition competencies. This course focuses on safely preparing for live burns, using gas-fired and non-gas-fired permanent structural props, and working with exterior live fire props. Students will cover incident reports of actual live fire training accidents, current live fire training legal requirements, and how to be compliant with industry standards. (CEU: DFS 12-Instructor)

This is a self-paced blended delivery course. In the 30 days preceding the conference, participants will complete pre-course work online, at their own pace but before meeting in-person for the last twelve-hours of class. This course requires a computer, and reliable Internet access. The scheduled completion date of this course is November 3, 2017.

## DOUGLAS K. CLINE

Chief Doug Cline for the Training and Professional Development Division with Horry County Fire Rescue, is a thirty-eight year fire and emergency services veteran. He is a well-known international speaker and instructor, presenting dynamic, power packed, high intensity programs on leadership, instructor development, officer development, fire ground tactics, rapid intervention team training, and firefighter safety and survival. Cline is a published author of articles, blogs, and textbooks for both the fire service and EMS. As a chief officer he is a distinguished authority of officer development and has traveled internationally delivering programs on leadership and officer development. He has a diverse line of training videos on leadership, rapid intervention team training, vehicle fires, hose line management, emergency vehicle operations and fireground safety and survival.



## PHIL JOSE

Deputy Chief Phillip Jose has thirty years of service with the Seattle Fire Department. He is an Operations Deputy Chief and chairs both the Standard Operating Guideline and the Post Incident Analysis committees. He was *Seattle Fire Chief of the Year* in 2013. Phil teaches nationally on reading smoke, air management, instructional craftsmanship, and tactical decision making. He has been a FDIC instructor for fourteen years and is a corecipient of the FDIC *Tom Brennan Training Achievement Award* in 2008. He is the author of *Air Management for the Fire Service* as well as the train-the-trainer, and Fire Engineering's, *Handbook for Firefighter 1 and 2*, and their *Bread and Butter* video for self contained breathing apparatus.



## CHUCK BAIRD

Chuck Baird is a twenty-eight year veteran of the fire service, who retired from his department as a captain assigned to a triple company, engine, truck, and rescue in December 2016. He currently serves as the Fire Science Technology Program Director at Georgia Piedmont Technical College in Covington, Georgia. He has served as a training officer over the first twenty years of his career, both as a staff instructor and adjunct instructor. He was the captain of the training division for six years guiding day to day operations and has actively taught firefighters, EMS providers, and the public since 1991. He is a NPQ III Fire and Emergency Services Instructor and Georgia Level III EMS Instructor. He has earned three college degrees including a Masters Degree in Executive Fire Service Leadership from Grand Canyon University in Phoenix, Arizona. Baird is also a graduate of the National Fire Academy's Executive Fire Officer Program. He has served as the chairperson for the Metro Atlanta Training Officers Section of the Metro Atlanta Fire Chiefs Association for the past six years. He has taught within local fire and EMS academies, the Georgia Fire Academy, and regional and national conferences, including five years at FDIC.
